The La Crosse Area has formed coalitions and created programs that shelter, feed, and assist our neighbors who are experiencing homelessness. But, what if there were a way to end chronic homelessness and the suffering it causes? What if this could be done while preventing any families from having homelessness being part of their future? *Join the conversation with Erin.*

Erin Healy is a national expert on collaborative efforts to prevent and ending homelessness. She specializes in systems innovation, movement building, and supporting teams to achieve concrete, ambitious goals. Erin was a leader of the movement to house 100,000 of the nation's most vulnerable homeless individuals within four years. The campaign exceeded its goal, with 186 communities housing 105,580 homeless individuals. The campaign was featured on 60 Minutes, in the Harvard Business Review and New York Times, and was awarded the 2013 United Nations World Habitat Award. In 2015, Erin started her own consulting firm, promoting problem-solving collaborations (www.erinhealyconsulting.com). She lives in Brooklyn, NY.
